JERRY AND VIRGINIA MORICAL ARE 1995 "OUTSTANDING CONSERVATIONISTS"



The Morical's were also recognized for leadership and involvement in community activities, including church board, elevator board, telephone board, the County Pork Producers, the "Care Connection" friends of the Alexandria Technical College, 4-H, and founding membership in the Viking Sportsmen Club. They also served as the 1993 host for the National Farm & Ranch Management Educators, the host farm for the Chamber of Commerce "Business to Farm Tour" and the "Communicating for Agriculture" Exchange Student Host.
